### SCALE OR GAUGE?

Often the terms scale and gauge are confusing terms to the beginning model railroader.

Scale refers to the measurement used in building a model. Some of the common scales used in model construction are 1/2", 3/8", 1/4", 3.5mm. each representing one foot in real life.

Gauge refers to the distance between the rails of a railroad track.

To add to the confusion we sometimes hear the term HO gauge, O gauge, N gauge. The proper terms should be HO scale, O scale and N scale, because in HO scale you will model to the scale of 3.5 mm to the foot, but the gauge of the track could represent standard gauge (4'8.5") or (36" narrow gauge) or ( broad gauge 66" ) or any other gauge you might

want to model.

Remember Scale refers to size and proportion of the model and Gauge refers to the distance between the rails of the track that the model uses.
